There are exhibitions that concentrate on **Gustav Klimt** – my favorite is the Beethoven Frieze by Klimt at the Secession Building overwhelming! There is a fabulous exhibition at the Belvedere showing all works by **Egon Schiele** . Just to name a few.

Explore The Sounds of Austria with a Art Nouveau Walking Tour

There is much to see about the Wiener Werkstätte - established by Koloman Moser and Josef Hoffmann in 1903. It can be best described as a production community of visual arts. (There was a great exhibit of the Wiener Werkstätte at the Neue Gallerie in NYC).

However, this being Vienna, one can see much of this great Art Nouveau (Jugend Stil) in public places: such as the row of fabulous apartment houses on Linke Wienzeile (4th dist.), the subway station Karlsplatz (designed by Otto Wagner), the Secession Building (which we Viennese lovingly call "Krauthäuptl"-cabbage head), the Austrian Postal Savings Bank (Otto Wagner) and the church on Steinhof (again Otto Wagner).

The Majolikahaus

At Wienzeile 40 in Vienna, the Majolikahaus was built in 1898. The façade is clad in majolica tiles by Wienerberger, decorated with floral motifs.


